



For several years it was driven to and from the office a few times a week with a ½ mile commute each way.



Despite long periods of inactivity, when called upon it's always a willing playmate. Aside from a broken distributor belt and a few broken cables in the power top, the car has never had a problem. There is a good chance I will drive this car on April 26 for the Fire to Water run. It will be a great opportunity to blow out some of the cobwebs. I hope to see you there!

About a month ago, my very good friend invited me to attend the PCA Drivers Education training course at Spring Mountain Motorsports Ranch in Pahrump. I was apprehensive to say the least, but decided to go anyway. It was an opportunity I wasn't sure I would ever see again. So, onward I went. I acquired a helmet, "SA 2000 or better," rounded up my courage, and jumped in headfirst. Its okay, I was wearing the helmet!

As we headed out to the track, racecar in tow, my excitement mounted. The drive from Las Vegas to Pahrump seemed to fly by, and in no time we were entering the gates to the track. I took a moment and perused the assortment of people and their vehicles that were in attendance. One of the first things I noted was the lack of females in attendance and then I realized that I was one of only two women drivers. I was also the only female driver that did not have any experience driving in more than just commuter traffic.

Now the pressure was on. I was in a man's world with my ego to keep intact. Cars, racetracks, barbeque, and testosterone would be my company for the next two days. Although it was a PCA event, there were plenty of people with vehicles other than the illustrious Porsche. Cars of many makes and models were represented: Alfa Romeo, Chevy, Ford, Nissan, and BMW all with the same goal. Driving fast!

Before we could sport our helmets and start the engines, we had to take care of important matters; an introductory drivers meeting and then classroom driving instruction. We were given explanations of safety, flag meanings, vehicle handling and track layout. Now we could go on the track, right? Wrong! Off to avoidance maneuvering and braking, and the skid pad. For

me the skid pad was the most nerve-wracking portion of the weekend. For some reason, spinning out in that confined area had me very nervous.

All right ... now we get to fire up the engines and drive on the track! As a student driver, we were assigned an instructor who would guide us through the course, explain how to handle turns on the track, and drive the fastest and safest line. Lucky for me, I have a pretty close connection with the Chief Driving Instructor, Scott Mann, and was given the opportunity to have him instruct me. (Was that a test on the nerves? Talk about intimidating!) But, Scott was very patient and understanding, and he gave me great direction and input on how to improve my driving, and maneuvering skills. He also allowed me to make mistakes and corrections on my own. Scott's positive attitude and constructive criticism helped me to improve at every session, and on every lap. Soon, I was not only feeling more comfortable, but I was driving a lot faster as well.

By midday, I was really starting to get comfortable with the car and with my improving abilities. Then I attempted my first downshift using the "heel-toe" technique Scott had shown me prior to our visit to the track. Did I mention what a brave man he is? My attempt did not go quite as intended and the back end swung to the left. Although I was able to keep the car on the blacktop, this incident reminded me of the importance of listening to your instructor, your car, and most importantly, your instincts. So, my Saturday ended with a somewhat frightening, but adrenaline pumping, event.

Sunday dawned with the anticipation of another day on the track. I was so excited. I could barely sleep the night before! I just wanted to drive again! So, after a refresher driver's meeting, we took to the cars for another fun day.

I was told that it is important to drive with different instructors, so I was assigned to a new instructor, Brad Zucuroff. Brad pointed out some things that I could improve on, and reinforced the ones I had already learned. Again ... another instructor, with a positive attitude, and encouragement at every turn, to guide me. (No pun intended!)

My next session was coming up and I was told that Tony Mazaggatti was going to be my instructor. Now I was intimidated! I had heard about Tony. He was touted as one of the best, if not the best, driver out there! ... And he was going to instruct me? As he got in the car I attempted to relax and just do what Scott and Brad had told me. Of course, I had no reason to be nervous with Tony at all. He was just as the other instructors had been, absolutely positive, with nothing but constructive criticism, and he was very complimentary towards my limited driving ability.

I could not have had a better experience as a first time visitor to a PCA event. Everyone associated with the club: Tony Zito, Andy McCardle, Soloman Braun, Scott Mann, Randy Gabe, and every one of the instructors that I worked with, were so gracious and inviting. It would be hard not to like them. Plus...they are all great drivers as well. After learning so much from all of them, I can only hope that it will transfer to my daily driving. I can't wait to have another opportunity to spend time with the wonderful personalities and talent that make up the Las Vegas Region PCA ... and hopefully get the opportunity to drive again!




